She began her teaching career after graduating from Valley City State University in 1967 with a BS Degree/Composite Major in Music. She taught instrumental and vocal music grades 1-12 in North Dakota Schools. She has taught private piano for over 40 years!

Darla is an NDMTA certified teacher of music and was awarded the NDMTA Teacher of the year in 2012. She has served on the NDMTA state board as well as the UVMTA board. She retired to Fargo, ND in 2014 where she is an FMMTA member and presently serves on their board of directors.



Darla has dedicated her life to furthering Arts and Education in schools in several ND/MN communities. She has composed vocal/instrumental arrangements for special groups her entire career. She served on the Board of Directors for the Park Rapids Community Theater and was also musical director and pianist for 12 major summer musical productions.

Darla has done extensive accompanying for her church music worship team, church choir/cantatas, school concerts, music contests, weddings, and funerals. She adjudicates music contests, rallies, talent shows and pageants. Since her move to Fargo, she has been an accompanist for Carl Ben Eielson Middle School, South High School and Davies High School for their music contests and concerts. She finds great joy in working with students of all ages and sharing her love of music and the piano.

Darla has been married to her husband Claude for 56 years and together they raised 3 children and are blessed with 6 grandchildren.

## **Officers' Reports:**

Secretary: Minutes from the June 1, 2022 Board Meeting were posted. M/S/C by Vangie Johnson Parker, Amy Mercer to approve the minutes.

Treasurer: Michelle Kallod submitted Treasurer's Report.

Checking account balance \$25,726.85

Savings account balance \$15,173.12

Vice-President/Commissioned Composer: Michael Langer reported that he has Lisa Bost-Sandberg, a flute professor at UND, as our 2023 Commissioned Composer. She has accepted and signed at the mtna.org portal.

M/S/C by Vangie Johnson Parker, Sheryl Kjelland to accept, acknowledge and appreciate Michael Langer's work on this process and that we are thrilled to have Lisa Bost-Sandberg as our 2023 Commissioned Composer.

There was some discussion encouraging 2024 and possibly 2025 Commissioned Composer to be proposed, discussed, chosen and approved to loosen the time crunch on this project.

President: Tamara Bertram reported the following:

- She attended the MTNA Summit Meeting and that it was very good.
- She signed contract with Catherine Rollins for 2023 NDMTA Conference.
- She will submit Chris Gables' 2022 Commissioned Composition to MTNA before December 1.
- She is working on setting up the NDMTA Endowment Fund.
- She received the non-profit status for NDMTA through MTNA
- She is continuing the efforts to publicize and encourage the Virtual Local possibility for those members who need it.
- She stated that the Service to the Profession Trophy needs some specifics on it, by adding NDMTA to it, or ????

#### **Committees:**

Advertising: Anne Morris has sold \$1,750 in ads. She has received \$1,225 in advertising money and is waiting to receive the remaining \$525. It has been a challenging process this year.

Certification/Service to the Profession: Amy Mercer wondered about dividing this into two positions, but was encouraged to keep it as it is.

Competitions: Sue Nagel reported that the state competition will be held at VCSU on October 22, 2022. There will be 3 YA pianists competing. There are 5 ND representatives (JR Composition, JR Woodwinds, SR Strings, YA Woodwinds, SR Woodwinds) that will submit performance videos, as well as the winning YA Pianist to the District Competition.

Directory: Michelle Schumacher reported that she is working to complete the Directory. There are 17 members who have applied to receive it virtually.

Foundation: Dianna Anderson asks that members donate to Foundation Fellow in honor of Darla Sheldon. We need to name a new person for next year's Foundation Fellow nominee.

Historian: Di Wu is the new historian and she needs information from past Historians.

IMTF: Lisa Schuler stated that Beth Klingenstein will be the IMTF presenter at the 2023 NDMTA Conference.

Membership: Lisa Schuler reported that she attended a WCD membership meeting via zoom. She wants us to encourage memberships.

Nominating: Priscilla Keogh had nothing to report.

Popplers Competition: Tamara Bertram is the new Chair of this event.
