Conference Presenter - Catherine Rollin

A noted composer who combines her performing career with teaching prize-winning students, Catherine Rollin has traveled to more than 100 cities in the United States, Canada, Japan, and Taiwan to present her workshops and masterclasses.

Ms. Rollin received her bachelor of musical arts degree with distinction from the University of Michigan and her master of music degree from Oakland University School of Performing Arts. Her work as a composer has won her many distinctions. Among these, Ms. Rollin has been commissioned by the Clavier Companion magazine, the Music Teachers National Association (MTNA), and the Michigan Music Teachers Association. Several of her compositions have been selected for the National Federation of Music Clubs Festivals Bulletin.

She has also served as a judge on the national level for the MTNA Student Composition Competition and as a member of the prestigious panel of judges for the Lynn Freeman Olson Composition Contest. Recently, Ms. Rollin was commissioned by the MTNA's prestigious series: From the Pen to the Premiere. This commissioned work -- a trio for flute, alto saxophone and piano called Suite Detroit-- premiered at the MTNA 2018 national conference in Orlando.

Additionally, in the fall of 2018, Ms. Rollin was honored to be featured by the Steinway Society as both a composer and pianist in concert. Prominently featured at that concert was a multimedia presentation of Ms. Rollin's ASCAP award winning series: Museum Masterpieces, Books 1-4.

Our NDMTA Foundation Fellow Nominee for 2024... Dr. Robert Groves!

Dr. Robert Groves has been a member of the North Dakota State University faculty since 1972. His graduate degrees were completed at the University of Iowa, and his principal piano teachers were Arthur Lambert and John Simms with additional study with Joanna Graudan and Vitya Veronsky. His teaching specialties are studio piano, piano pedagogy, chamber music, and music history. He also maintains a private studio of pre-college age piano students ranging in age from early elementary school through late high school. He retired from full-time teaching at the NDSU in 2020 and now teaches 4-6 undergraduate and graduate piano majors and music history courses.



As a member of the piano faculty at NDSU, Dr. Groves has been an active performer, clinician, adjudicator, and author for 50 years. These include serving as coordinator of piano studies at the International Music Camp for over 25 years, numerous lecture/performances through the North Dakota Humanities Council and the Institute for Regional Studies, summer piano teacher workshops, and guest appearances for many of the regional music teacher associations. A number of his university as well as pre-college piano students have been finalists or winners of piano competitions. His approach to teaching piano pedagogy is based on the concept of "applied" pedagogy, in which he places particular focus on helping identify solutions to specific playing challenges (technical, musical, performance-oriented, etc.) commonly encountered by piano students. Dr. Groves also has been highly successful in helping pianists at all playing levels to understand and eventually eliminate recurring tendonitis in their playing. In 2017 he completed a book on the history of music at NDSU (Music at NDSU) published by the NDSU Press, and in 2018 was recognized for his "Service to the Profession" at the NDMTA state meeting.

Commissioned Composer - Dr. Lisa Bost-Sandberg

The NDMTA 2023 Commissioned Composer is Dr. Lisa Bost-Sandberg of Grand Forks. As chair of the Commissioned Composer, I compiled a list of interesting composers residing in North Dakota. Lisa stood out to me as someone whose has an international presence and pushes boundaries in her compositions. The state board unanimously agreed to commission Lisa in November and she accepted.

To see Lisa perform is to experience a world of instruments and sounds you never knew existed. She performs and writes for every flute—from piccolo down to the unusual bass flute—as well as writing chamber works or all instruments. Her works explore every possible timbre and mood that each instrument can produce. Lisa has told me she is writing a piano solo and plans to have it premiere by her friend, the internationally known concert pianist Éva Polgár .

Lisa is the Teaching Assistant Professor of Flute at UND. She was raised in Montana and holds degrees in flute performance and composition from the University of Iowa, New York University, and the University of North Texas. In demand as a soloist and chamber musician, she has performed throughout the United

States and Europe, including National Flute Association conventions, new music festivals, and guest appearances and masterclasses at universities.

Lisa's compositions have been performed at conferences of the American Trombone Workshop, World Saxophone Congress, North American Saxophone Alliance, National Flute Association, Society of Composers, and Iowa Composers Forum. Recent projects include *Starling* for flute quartet, commissioned by Elizabeth Robinson, and *Strikingly* for piccolo and fixed media, commissioned by Claudia Anderson as part of her "Glass Ceilings" commission and performance project. *Chroma*, a collaboration with artist and commissioner Marjorie Schlossman, is the subject of a short film by Mary Trunk and Caren McCaleb. Lisa's works have been honored as prize-winners and finalists in composition competitions of the National Flute Association, the Flute New Music Consortium, and the American Trombone Workshop.

Lisa's commissioned work will premiere at the 2023 NDMTA state conference in Dickinson on Wednesday, June 7 during the Opening Recital at 7:00 p.m. in Klinefelter Hall on the campus of Dickinson State University. For more on Lisa and to hear her compositions, visit www.lisabost.com/compositions.
