WYNN-ANNE ROSSI TO BE FEATURED CLINICIAN AT NDMTA STATE CONFERENCE, JUNE 21-23



The North Dakota State Conference on June 21-23 will feature Wynn-Anne Rossi, a nationally acclaimed composer who has composed many of the student pieces we teach our students. Wynn-Anne brings expertise in the art of teaching composition to students and working with students on many levels. She will be presenting four workshops for us at the Conference which are titled and described below. Her resume says the following:

Wynn-Anne Rossi is a nationally acclaimed composer whose works have reached audiences throughout the Unites States, Europe and Australia. She has over 70 publications (Boston, Alfred and FJH Publishing), and her commissions have included works sponsored by the National Endowment for the Arts, Minnesota Public Radio and the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra. Wynn-Anne has a specialty for bringing the art of composition to young musicians. She has been teaching composition residencies in Minnesota schools since 2003, inspiring hundreds of teenagers to write their own music. She has also written two comprehensive series which encourage young pianists to compose: "Music by Me" (FJH) and the new "Creative Composition Toolbox" (Alfred). Wynn-Anne enjoys lecturing throughout the country on a variety of subjects. Her education includes theory/composition at the U of Colorado, jazz at the U of Illinois, choral conducting at Harvard and coaching under Pulitzer Prize recipient Aaron Jay Kernis. Wynn-Anne Rossi's sessions are as follows:

1. Teaching in the Age of Communication and Information

We live in an era of exponential change and short attention spans. With access to limitless information and world communication, we are surrounded by computers, cell phones and constant banter on Facebook and Twitter. America will never be the same. Neither will piano instruction! Fast-paced learning has affected the brain itself, and as teachers, we must learn effective ways to keep passion for the piano alive. This session focuses on practical ways to successfully adapt to this new age. Discover simple ways to use technology and innovative ways to inspire your students.

2. Creative Play

Play is the most effective way we learn as children. How can play help us teach in the piano studio? "Playing the piano" can often feel like "working the piano" as students progress to higher levels. This session focuses on creative ways to interact with your students. Mix it up and learn to be spontaneous! \Box Playful interaction mixed with lively materials can lead to a lifelong love of music.

3. Composition Toolbox Showcase

Get out the hammers and nails! It's time to teach theory through practicing theory. Writing music is the most inspiring and practical way to learn the nuts and bolts of music. In this session, Wynn-Anne will present "Creative Composition Toolbox", a 6-book series that introduces students to the art of original composition. As your students "learn by doing", they will delve into new realms of personal self-expression while growing in musical self-esteem.

4. Student Composer Masterclass

Learn by doing is the philosophy behind original composition. This session takes a different approach. Learn by watching! Discover tips and tools of teaching composition as Wynn-Anne interacts with student composers and their music. Wynn-Anne has been teaching students of various levels to compose for 25 years. Each year, she presents composition residencies in the Minnesota public schools, sponsored by the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra and the Cowles Center for Performing Arts.

Memories of Maxine Aarestad (by Kathy Bresee)

I wanted to share some thoughts about Maxine – she was such an integral part of the formation of Fargo-Moorhead Music Teachers Association and in the life of piano teachers in the state of North Dakota. She was the state chairperson of the Rally for many years and worked with writing the original tests and then when it was decided that a workbook for students and teachers would be most helpful – once again her organizational and business skills came into play. I didn't work along with her during those early days – I reaped the benefits of her work! I got to realize those skills – and her deep love for the rally when we as a state decided that we needed to upgrade. It was the early 1990's , Maxine, Janie Green, Linda Wallevand and myself, Kathy Bresee worked many days writing – rewriting , hashing out goals and trying to make the best possible evaluation for our students in the state. It was an overwhelming task but we came to each meeting with a goal – and the home work that we were each to do. We provided copies for each person so that we could work efficiently and started the work that we had at hand for that day. At lunch time – we had lunch with chatter about gardens, birds, china painting and the myriad of other wonderful things of life other than music.

I smile when I think about Maxine and the excitement she had when she got her first computer – she was so enthused and her enthusiasm spread to all of us – she was never daunted by something new – it was always a wonderful adventure. She would tell of conversations she had with her son in solving each problem – I experience that "fun" with my son now.

Each person who knew Maxine has their own wonderful memories. These are just a few of mine. I just think it is important that the family know how important that she was not only to her students but to her fellow teachers. Her dreams are still being met – our local FMMTA will have its Rally on March 31st this year. Her legacy to our Local and State students goes on.

A few thoughts from Arlene Gray, Bismarck-Mandan, immediate past president...over one year ago I began training as a CNA to work full time in a nursing home. The job fell through after four months and I felt devastated. The month of December 2010 was one of sorting through priorities and making decisions about the future. One of my student's moms steered me toward opening a private studio. She designed business cards then gave them to me as a Christmas gift. That was one year ago and I am slowly rebuilding a fine home studio. I retired from BSC adjunct teaching to teach privately. I continue to play Sunday morning church services on pipe organ, accompany a home daycare one hour a week and am employed one workday a week playing music therapy piano at a nursing home.

Anyhow, I hope there are young teachers, now, who dream of teaching at a college, of attending national conferences and sitting on the state board. I have done this and enjoyed the experiences afforded me through BSC, BMMTA, MTNA and NDMTA. *Please consider volunteering to participate in the workings of your local and state organization.* You will meet wonderful people and be inspired by the energy and passion the North Dakota teachers bring to their work. Representing the state of North Dakota at MTNA Conference is thrilling and a privilege. The opportunities are endless and exhilarating. Give it a try!

If the national conference is out of reach, plan to attend the smaller state conference next June in Bismarck. It is one and a half days with nationally recognized clinician Wynn-Anne Rossi and an opening session by Beth Klingenstein of Valley City. Look over the registration and schedule. President Kathleen Johnson called the meeting to order. Roll call was taken with 9 members in attendance: Kathleen Johnson, Lisa Schuler, Jan Herr, Beth Klingenstein, Kathy Bresee, Arlene Gray, Mary Leaf, Ellen Croy, and Karen Dalager.

A motion to adopt the agenda was made by Beth Klingenstein; seconded by Jan Herr. Motion passed.

<u>Correspondence</u>

<u>MTNA Board of Competitions</u> Kathleen Johnson received a letter stating that the board has rescinded its decision to eliminate any competitions at this point. They will also focus on expanding programs for non-piano teachers.

<u>Gary Ingle</u> The letter was sent to inform members that there has been a complaint filed to the Ohio Attorney General's Office and that financial information has been requested from MTNA. Gary Ingle assured members that nothing is amiss.

<u>Maxine Aarestad</u> Kathie Johnson announced that NDTMA member, Maxine Aarestad had passed away on February 1st. She read her obituary and sent her condolences to the Fargo-Moorhead group. Jan Herr read a letter that will be sent to Maxine's family. There will be an article in the February newsletter.

<u>Marge Johnson</u> It was announced that Marge's husband passed away on February 2nd. Condolences were sent to Marge from NDMTA.

Reports of Officers

<u>Secretary Report</u> Lisa Schuler read the minutes from the October 22, 2011 IVN meeting. The minutes were approved as read.

<u>Treasurer Report</u> Kathy Bresee attended the State Auditions in Valley City and wrote checks for the winners. She completed and emailed the report from the Auditions to board members. She also completed the Quarterly report for the 2nd quarter, received approval of the nonprofit status by the IRS, made deposits and paid bills as presented and sent the books from the 2010–2011 fiscal year to Ellen Croy and Ann Holmen for auditing. Kathy would like guidelines for expenses. She also requested that bills that need to be paid be given to her at least once a month so that the books are accurate.

<u>MTNA Competitions</u> Kathleen Johnson read the results from the competitions held in October 2011 as well as the results from the Northwest Division competitions.

Kathleen Johnson corresponded with Arlene Grav in President Report setting up the 2012 Conference, contacted Williston for the IMTF Luncheon program, sent a statement to MTNA Board on behalf of NDMTA concerning the dropping of the MTNA instrumental competitions except for piano, attended the State President's Advisory Council meeting via phone concerning the dropping of the MTNA instrumental competitions, set up IVN meeting for Feb. 4th, contacted NDMTA board members, sent and received contract from Wynn-Anne Rossi for 2012 NDMTA Conference, and promotion information and picture and received approval from Alfred for \$300 to pay for Wynn-Anne Rossi's travel expenses and sent in requested information to Alfred concerning Ms. Rossi's sessions and music store contact information in Bismarck, corresponded with Mike Halstenson concerning Commissioned Composer 2013, sent in Dr. Carter's (CC for 2011) composition to the MTNA, attended MTNA competitions in Valley City in Oct. and sent out congratulatory notes to the Division winners in Jan. Advertising No report

<u>AAA/Local Association</u> Ann Morris continues to collect local association reports from our local presidents and keeps them on file. She will continue to read the articles in the "American Music Teacher" publication and other articles about Arts Advocacy. She will continue to make the state aware of the importance of music education. She regrets that she won't be able to attend the National Convention this year so she won't be able to attend the Arts, Awareness and Advocacy meeting.

<u>Certification/Teacher of the Year</u> Lynda Pearson corresponded with a teacher interested in pursuing the associate level of tested certification through NDMTA, corresponded with Anne Morris about a group in Fargo interested in associate (tested) levels of state certification and mailed letters to 8 local presidents about nominating teachers for the state teacher of the year award to be given at the conference in June. Lynda is studying the brochure for further revision and eventual inclusion on the state website. She is working on the description that may include portfolios for each certification board member. She's putting together recommendations for updating the NDMTA website's certification menu offerings.

Some members thought it would be easier to keep the regular directory each year so that the ads could be sold the same way each year. She telephoned national officer and MTNA office for an update on funds. NDMTA has reached the full thousand dollars for Sara Bloom. She will be honored at the NYC Conference Gala.

He has not confirmed his availability. She is working with BSC to secure rooms for conference and competitions.

<u>Rally</u> Sheryl Kjelland received Rally Materials from Illinois, copied and distributed these Rally Materials to LAMTA and Northwest MTA for their November Rallies. She also handled an inquiry from a new NDMTA member about acquiring Rally Syllabus, etc. Sheryl sent her the 1A, 1B & 1C Study Sheets that our NDMTA Rally Committee made. She will send Rally Materials to FMMTA for their spring Rally. She will be sure that UVMTA also has necessary materials for their upcoming April Rally.

Business

<u>Directory</u> For now the normal directory will be printed on a yearly basis.

<u>Conference in NYC</u> Kathleen Johnson, Beth Klingenstein, Melody Bober and Arlene Gray will attend the national conference in New York City. Kathy Bresee made a motion that Beth Klingenstein bring a\$50.00 item from North Dakota to the national conference; seconded by Jan Herr. Motion passed. North Dakota will not have a Gala Table this year being only 4 people are attending.

<u>Conference presenters for 2013 in Fargo</u> Diana Skroch, Dr. Groves, Penny Simons, Troy Toavs and Nariaki Sugiura were suggested presenters for the 2013 conference. It was decided that those located in the eastern part of the state would be asked for the Fargo conference, which would be Diana Skroch, Dr. Groves and Nariake Sugiura. Nariaki may be asked to be the recitalist. Final decisions will be made at the June conference. Mary Sallee and Catherine Rollin are possibilities for the 2014 conference.

<u>Guidelines for Expenses</u> A discussion was held on the money allowances for chair positions and receipts from competition participants.
