NDMTA Executive Board Meeting

October 10, 2015

President Lisa Schuler called the meeting to order. Roll call: Lisa Schuler, Jeanette Berntson, Lynda Pearson, Vangie Parker, Kathy Bresee, Gloria Bethke, Alisha Harris, Darla Sheldon, Sue Nagel, Geraldine Ong, Michael Langer, Karen Kalinowski, Michelle Schumacher, Paige Keiser-Rezac, Ellen Croy, Michelle Kallod.

A motion was made by Vangie Parker to adopt the president's agenda. Second by Alisha Harris. Motion carried.

Officers Reports

Secretary Michelle Kallod read the minutes from the June board meeting. Pam Olson name was corrected from Pam Johnson for Service Award. Alisha Harris made a motion to accept the amended minutes. Second by Michelle Schumacher. Motion carried.

Treasurer Kathy Bresee reported total income was \$3488.00. Total expenses were \$521.88. Lisa Schuler will appoint two people to audit.

Vice President/Commission Composer Chair Jeanette Berntson gave her report. 5 people need newsletters mailed. Kathy Breese will copy the newsletters and mail them. New members have been contacted and will be asked to sign up for future newsletters via Mail Chimp.

President Lisa Schuler gave her report which included the need to fill NODAK chair and co-chair MTNA competitions. Surveys have been successful and will be continued, perhaps on competitions. Lisa suggested putting in writing what procedure to follow when a state conference registrant asks for a refund due to family emergency or funeral. The board discussed refunding 50% to 100%, but not food. Kathy & Lisa will write a paragraph to be ready for the Bismarck conference registration form.

Committees

Local Association (Bismarck) & Conference Report was given by Alisha Harris. Conference committee is working on coming up with a conference theme and Alisha has compiled list of responsibilities to delegate. Approved recitalists, Nariaki Sagura & his wife, acceptance for \$750 plus 2 nights hotel. Discussed and determined adding recitalist fee plus accommodations to the contract for conference recitalists as optional - each conference committee can decide. The board discussed session presenters, piano technician and Michael Langer. It was decided to have Michael Langer present 2 sessions in 2016 and a piano technician might be possible for the 2017 conference.

Directory Chair Michelle Schumacher gave her report indicating she would like to print the directory through another business, as Office Depot print quality was poor. Alisha, Lisa and Michelle will gather estimates from their local businesses to determine the best cost/quality to print. Michael Langer will be given a copy to proof before printing.

Advertising Chair Michael Langer gave his report. Michael will be reaching out to businesses who advertised in the directory, assuring them their ad quality will be better next year. Those who place an ad receive a free copy. Discussed giving \$25 credit to UND as they did not receive the cover ad, as promised. Discussed adding 2 cover ads to the front and back and increase cover ad pricing to \$150. Discussed website advertising.

Certification Chair Karen Kalinowski gave her report. The certification chair's job description will be updated to include awards being mentioned in the NDMTA newsletter & local newspaper. Karen will submit an article for the next newsletter regarding purging of old certification files. Corinne Nustad will be the new certification chair as of June, 2016.

MTA Competitions Sue Nagel, co-chair, reported 9 entrants in the competition to be held Saturday, October 24, 2015 at VCSU. YA Piano & SR Piano entrants will automatically advance as there are no other entries in their categories. They will be heard at NDSU on October 31. NDMTA will pay the NDSU professor \$100. Sue needs a replacement to assist with Geraldine Ong.

Foundation Chair Vangie Parker reported \$1003.00 has been raised for Jan Herr, our 2016 Foundation Fellow. She will help to find a roommate for Jan at the national conference in San Antonio.

Historian Darla Sheldon was not able to attend. She requested someone to take pictures the day of NODAK (Sue volunteered) and someone to take pictures at the national conference (all attending can provide pictures).

IMTF report was given by Ellen Croy. Requesting ideas for June Conference. Discussed topic of entering students in competitions and getting over the fear of doing so.

Paige Rezac gave the Membership report. Paige is working on adding value to being a state member. The pin estimate with our logo is expensive. Discussed adding number of years to state conference name tags. Idea proposed to contact local businesses for a discount cards for state memberships. Would need a volunteer from each local association. Idea was tabled until January meeting.

Newsletter report was given in absence of newsletter editor, Elsie Magnus. Board decided newsletter standardized font size as Arial 12. All articles are to be published in Word, with pictures imbedded in the article. Articles are to be labeled by the title, then author's name. Deadline for next newsletter is November 10. When submitting articles via email, include the month of the newsletter in the subject line.

Arlene Gray was unable to connect. NODAK . Dianna Anderson from Minot will be the 2016 adjudicator. Mileage is paid by NDMTA.

Nominating Chair Darla Sheldon no report, there are no positions to be filled.

Rally Chair Sheryl Kjelland was unable to attend. She now has the new syllabus and tests. Sheryl will update the tests and sample tests for Levels 1A, 1B, and 1C. Four Rallies will be held this year. Any comments or concerns about the tests can be shared with President Lisa Schuler and she will contact the Illinois president, co-writer of the materials.

Technology Chair Kathleen Johnson unable to attend. She has updated the website with members, award recipients, news highlight page and a link to businesses. Anyone with local association pictures or news, send them to Kathy.

Business

Treasurer's report on website: Discussed the motion made in June to put this report in the newsletters. Newsletters are put on the website, which is open to the public. Do we want to continue to do this or should it just be placed on the "Members Only "page and not in the newsletters? New motion made by Lynda Pearson to publish the annual budget in the newsletter. Second by Jeanette. Motion passed.

Discussed 2017 Commissioned Composers Nicholas Meyers, VCSU and Susan Clambey, FMMTA. Susan was chosen by vote. Jeanette will contact Susan Clambey.

Survey results on state conference was discussed. 32 people responded. Location was the biggest factor on conference attendance. One day conference fee discussed as an option for future conferences. The Bismarck local will discuss the fees for the 2016 conference and will get approval at the January meeting. Discussed alerting local presidents of upcoming surveys so they could alert their members.

Local Association Reports

We have seven active local associations and two inactive, for a total of nine. Brief reports were given from each one.

Jeanette is continuing to set up Mail Chimp as newsletter provider.

NDMTA Commissioned Composer, Rebecca (Lovcik) Raber, delighted everyone June 24, 2015, at the NDMTA State Conference at UND's Josephine Campbell Recital Hall in Grand Forks, ND. Her composition entitled "Jesu, dulcis memoria", was performed by four of her Shanley high school graduates:

Soprano – Beth Mortenson
Alto – Emily Olig
Tenor – Nicholas Kasper
Bass – Jacob Dixon

Mrs. Raber gave a very interesting introduction to the piece and described to all of us the process she used in writing the piece. Much thought went into every measure with the flow of the words and the interesting harmonics.

This is what Mrs. Raber said about writing the piece, "I love this text. It's been a favorite of mine for quite some time, since I first heard it in a setting by Victoria. You'll hear text painting in both a specific way, and also in a more subtle way (the repeated phrases 'Presentia' representing Jesus's presence that remains with us)... Ideally, it is to be sung by a choir... The expression of the text from the notes on the page, and ultimately, through the voices of my singers, is my artistic offering, but I also hope that it is a 'usable' piece that can function for conductors and choirs as well!"

The performance was met with a standing ovation by all of the people present. The teachers all agreed that besides being a beautiful piece to hear it could also be very usable for high school and college choirs.

We congratulate Mrs. Raber on her fine composition and will be anxious to see how it fares in the national compositions.

The **Conference Committee**, chaired by Jane Magrath, with Debra Florian, Jyoti Hench, Gary Ingle, Rebecca Johnson, Kasandra Keeling, Christie Sowby and Robert Vandall, have put together a wonderful conference taking place at the [Grand Hyatt](#). (Instructions on reservations for the hotel will be forthcoming, I included the link so you can start visualizing yourself basking in the luxury!)

The pre-conference **Pedagogy Saturday** takes place April 2, with five interchangeable tracks: (the chairs for each are listed below)

- Learning Theory—Lois Svard
- Musician Wellness, Co-sponsored by the American Psychoanalytic Association—Gail Berenson and Julie Nagel
- Recreational Music Making—Richard Rejino
- Teaching Artistry and Technique—Robert Weirich
- Young Professionals—Andrew Villemez

The Opening Session Recital on Saturday evening features [Time for Three](#), a classically trained string trio with Nick Kendall, Nikki Chooi, violins, Ranaan Meyer, double bass; and the Tuesday evening recital is with the renowned pianist, Emanuel Ax.

Seymour Bernstein, recipient of the 2015 Frances Clark Keyboard Pedagogy Award will give the Advanced Piano Master Class. If you haven't already, do catch the excellent Ethan Hawke documentary on him, [Seymour: An Introduction](#).

There will be two Intermediate Piano Master Classes given by Bruce Berr and Barbara Fast, and at each breakout timeslot there will be One for All Tracks of interest to teachers of all instruments.

The excitement at the opening of the vast Exhibit Hall, (9:00 A.M.–5:30 P.M. Sunday–Tuesday) is electric. There, one may browse sheet music, try out pianos, meet contemporary composers and hear them perform their works at Showcases (8:00 A.M. and 1:00 P.M. on the above dates), learn about new technologies and more. The only challenge is fitting everything in. One can always arrange for shipping items home or just bring a spare suitcase!

The finals of the MTNA Performance Competitions take place on Saturday (Junior/Chamber Music), Sunday (Senior) and Young Artist (Monday) with the Winners Concerts taking place the day following. It is inspiring to hear these motivated and talented musicians and the finals are open to all, at no charge.

The full schedule, with dates and times will be published very soon but here are three session sneak peeks!

- **Ingrid Clarfield and Peter Mack**—*Creating Magic In The Unexpected: Same Goals —Different Accents!* All musicians have the same goal—to move an audience. What can teachers do to make this magic happen? Two dynamic teachers share their creative strategies that work for them, and can work for you.
- **Elissa Milne**—(Accelerated Learning Session) *The 40-Piece Challenge: Strategies For Repertoire-rich Learning.* The 40-Piece Challenge: why it works, how it works, where it began and where it can take you and your students. Elissa Milne shares her insights on, and experiences of, repertoire-rich learning.
- **Edward Francis**—(One for All Session) *Establishing And Maintaining A Successful Private Studio.* The need for sharing practical and effective ideas to help private music teachers establish studios and remain successful is always relevant and popular. As the sole proprietor of a successful private studio for over more than 40 years Francis's history of effectively combining the private studio and college teaching may resonate with many young members as well as those who are in the middle years of their career.
